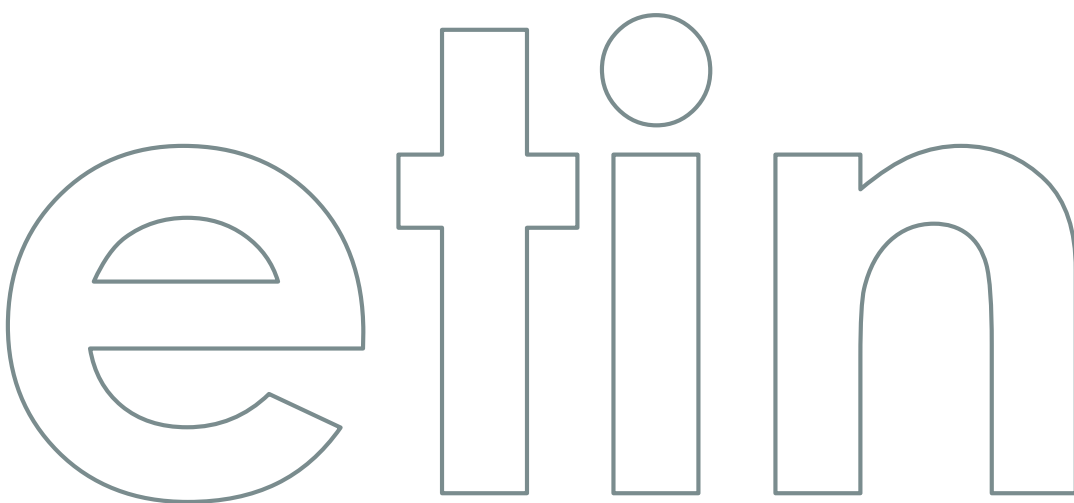

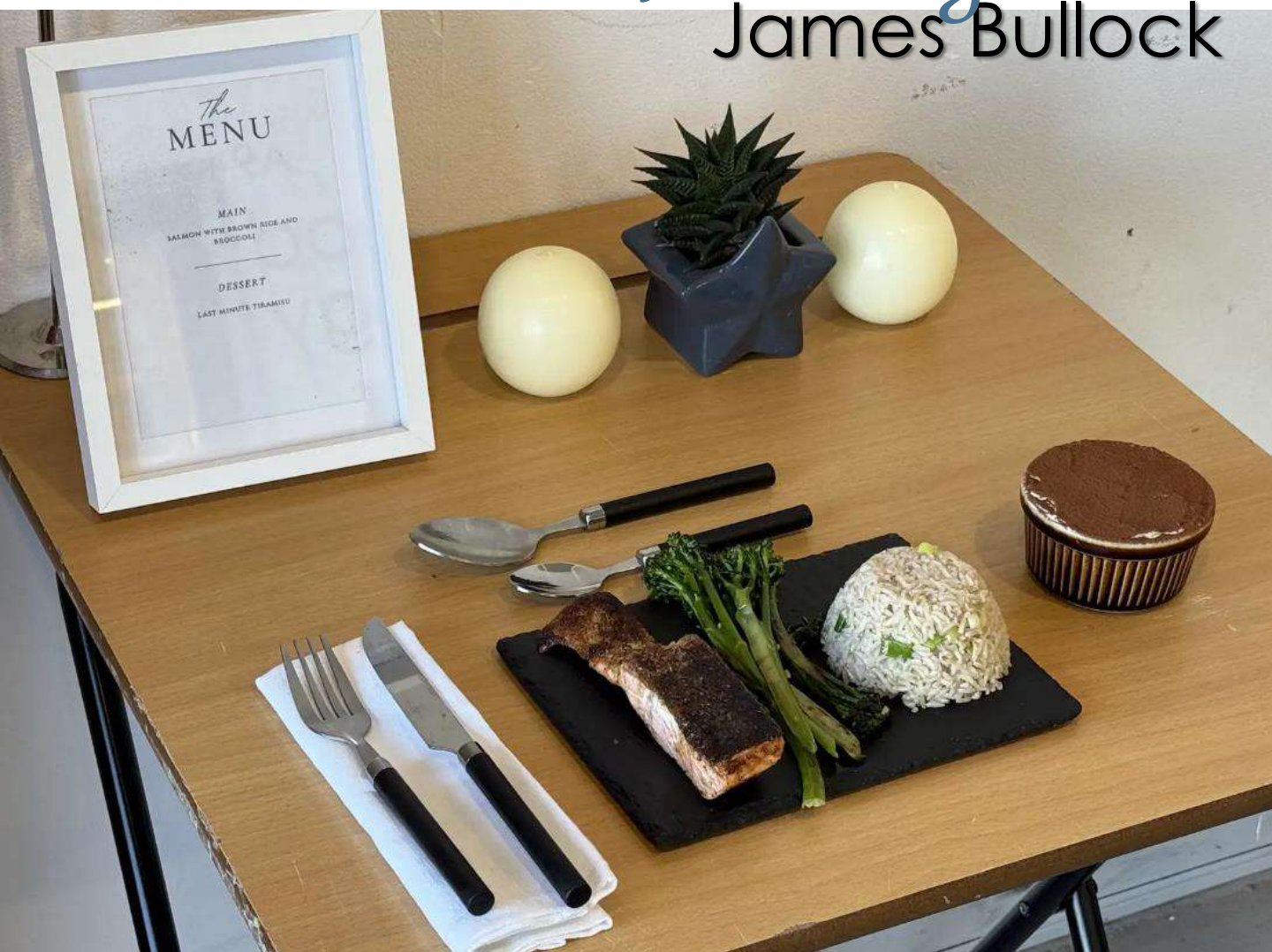


Kingston Rotary

Saccheri's Maj-vellous Climate Medicine

Head of Year 8, Inge-Maj Saccheri, is making her mark in more ways than one with her adoring cohort. Not satisfied with gaining a reputation as a kind and nurturing head of year with a sense of humour drier than the Finnish coniferous forests of her birth; she is also proving something of an advocate for fighting climate change.

Following in the tradition of pioneering "team science" practitioners who have exploded the Grey Court curriculum in recent years, Ms Saccheri, has developed a series of lessons as part of the "Zero Carbon Schools' project."

The initiative is a platform whereby students take action against climate change by reducing carbon emissions and promoting sustainable practices. This project aims to educate students about the importance of a carbon-neutral future and inspire creative thinking to tackle environmental issues. In Ms Saccheri's lessons students design and build sculptures from waste materials to highlight the excessive waste produced in daily life and its impact on the planet.

Although Ms Saccheri spent her teenage years in Liverpool (her Scouse Lilt has now been softened by Surry Hills vowels), her Dutch heritage meant she has lived in Holland where recycling has long been part of the national psyche. Ms Saccheri recalls being sent to the local shop with handfuls of glass bottles which she would exchange for 20 guilders a piece which gave a whole new meaning to the term cultural capital!

Saccheri's sustainability project is centred around student sculptures scavenged from the flotsam and jetsam of everyday life. In this Scouse Scandinavian climate warrior's own words: "the **rubbish sculptures** serve as powerful visual symbols, spreading awareness about the importance of recycling, reusing, and reducing waste. By turning discarded items into art, the students are demonstrating that waste has value and can be transformed into something meaningful."

The pictures below showcase 'The Tree of Life' by Atia, Frankie, Ben and Mari; 'Raya Latigo' by Janessa, Sofia, Harry and Matheus; and 'the Plastic Jellyfish' by Zoya, James, Zach, Ervaad, and Luisa. Guided by Maj-vellous Inge-Maj, each project embodies a shared commitment to a greener, zero-carbon future, brought to life through their creative and collaborative efforts.







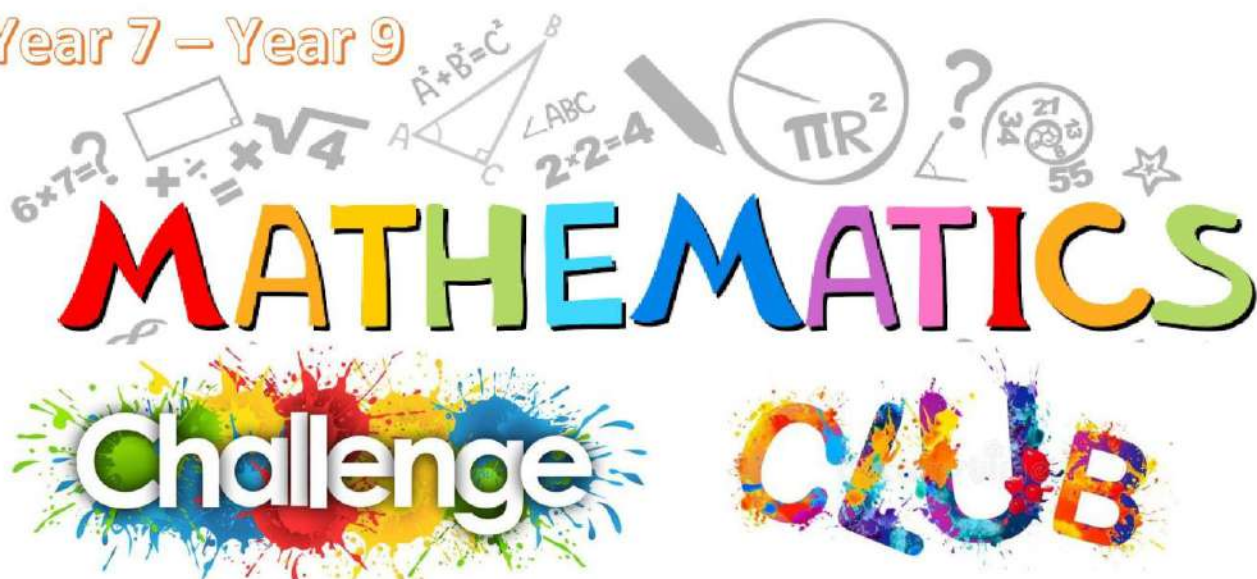
The project's ethos is being "recycled" by Ms Saccheri across the eight year eight design technology rotations that she teaches as each group being given a subtly different design brief from Big Blue Project to Octosquid to Reef of Rubbish. Children will be encouraged to pro-actively explore solutions to change through their sculptures which will be curated by part time conceptual artist and full-time Arsenal fan, Mr Forouhi into an immersive display in time for the next open morning. At the end of the cycle, the best sculptures will most definitely NOT be consigned to the scrapheap as they will adorn the school's sensory garden which is currently under construction.

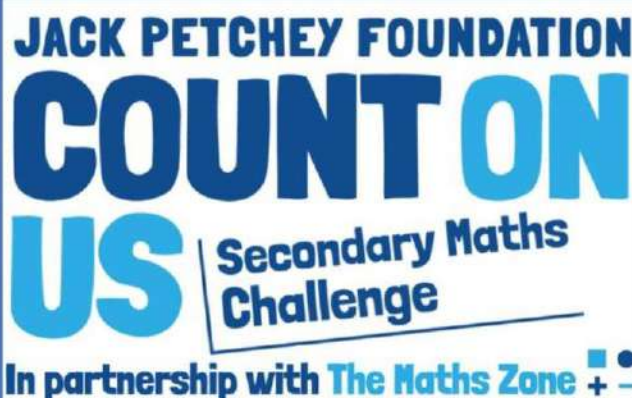

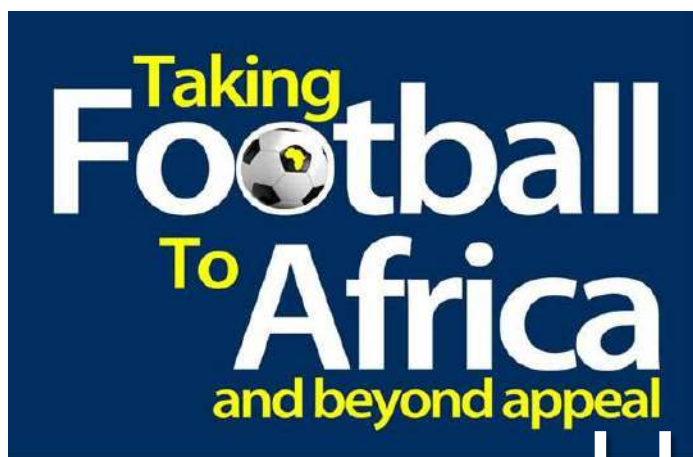

Update

While Grey Court students and parents might be very familiar with the second hand uniform shop, what is less well known is what happens to any surplus uniform or sports kit.

Last year we linked up with "Kit for taking football to Africa and Beyond". The charity distributes sportswear to school students around street children in Nairobi. This is all possible through the tireless efforts of two remarkable men, Alec Berry, and RAF Wing Commander, Neil Hope.

Grey Court kit has now arrived in Mathare school in Nairobi Kenya, with help from Lottie's Way charity, where it was delivered by partner charity, the Delightsome Organisation.

The Delightsome Organisation is a non-governmental, community based organisation who work with children and youth on the city streets especially in Mathare, Kamukunji and Starehe sub-counties. They give special attention to street families and try to tackle aspects in the community that have pushed them to the streets.

Mathare is a collection of slums in Nairobi with a population of approximately 500,000 people; the population of Mathare Valley alone, the oldest of the slums that make up Mathare, is 180,000 people. Mathare is the home of football teams Mathare United and Real Mathare of the MYSA.

The Lottie's Way charity, which is instrumental in bringing much needed equipment and kit to Nairobi, was set up in memory of Wing Commander Hope's Daughter who loved working with schools in Nairobi and who died tragically young.

We are delighted that Grey Court can play its small part in this vital charity.

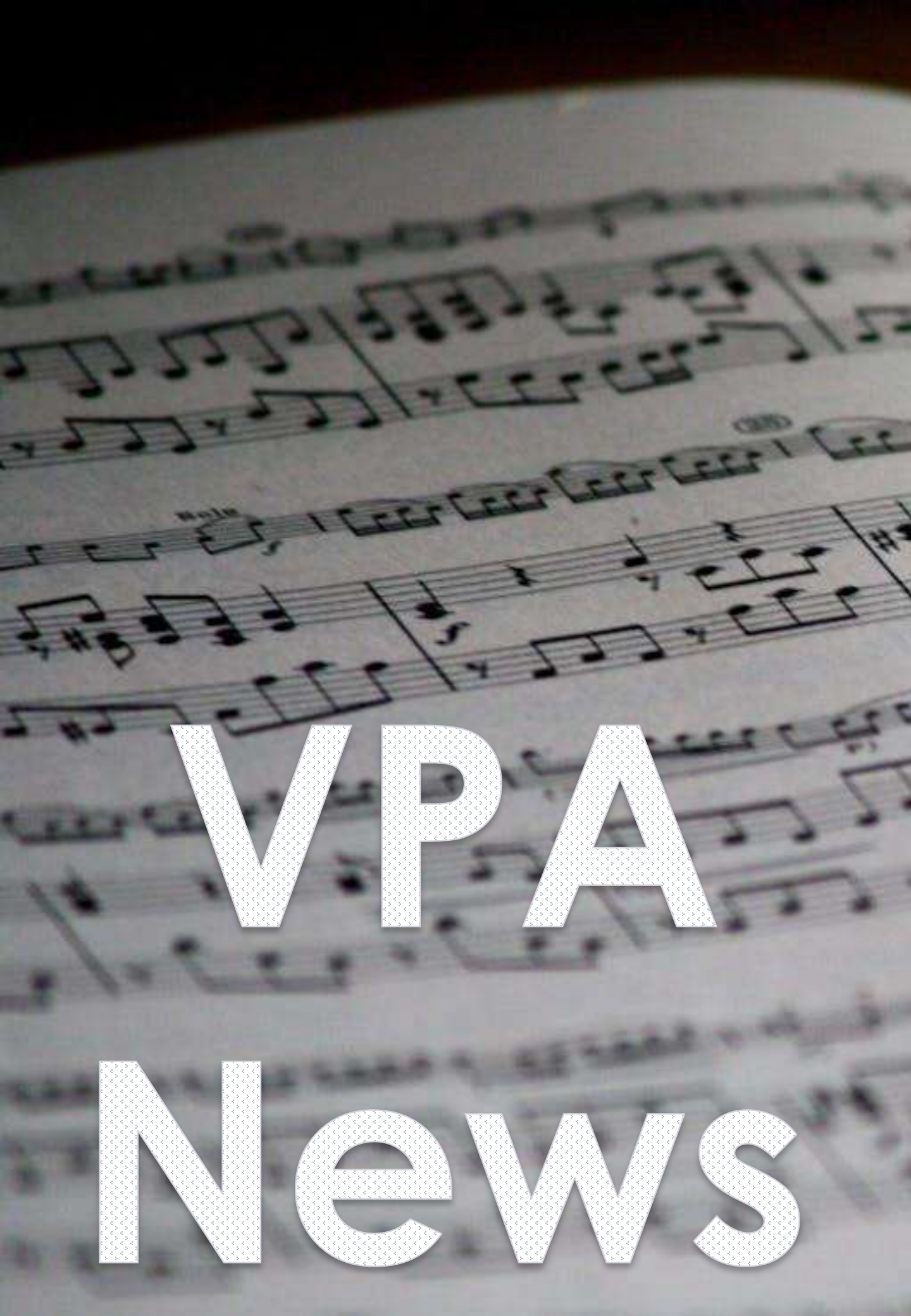

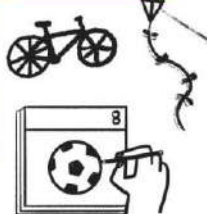

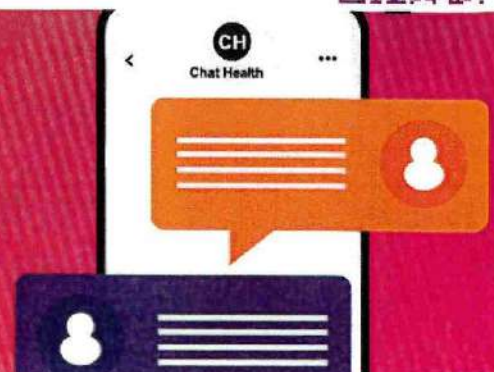

We all know how important exercise is for our physical wellbeing as well as our mental health, and here at ADHD Embrace, we especially encourage being active for our ADHD community. Parents and caregivers know well how energetic our children can be! And as kids grow into teenagers, maintaining an active lifestyle remains essential for both their physical and mental well-being. Many young people with ADHD have a natural talent for sport although we recognise that many find a structured clubs and sports don't always suit their needs. However, finding something to do - regardless of what it is - is so important.

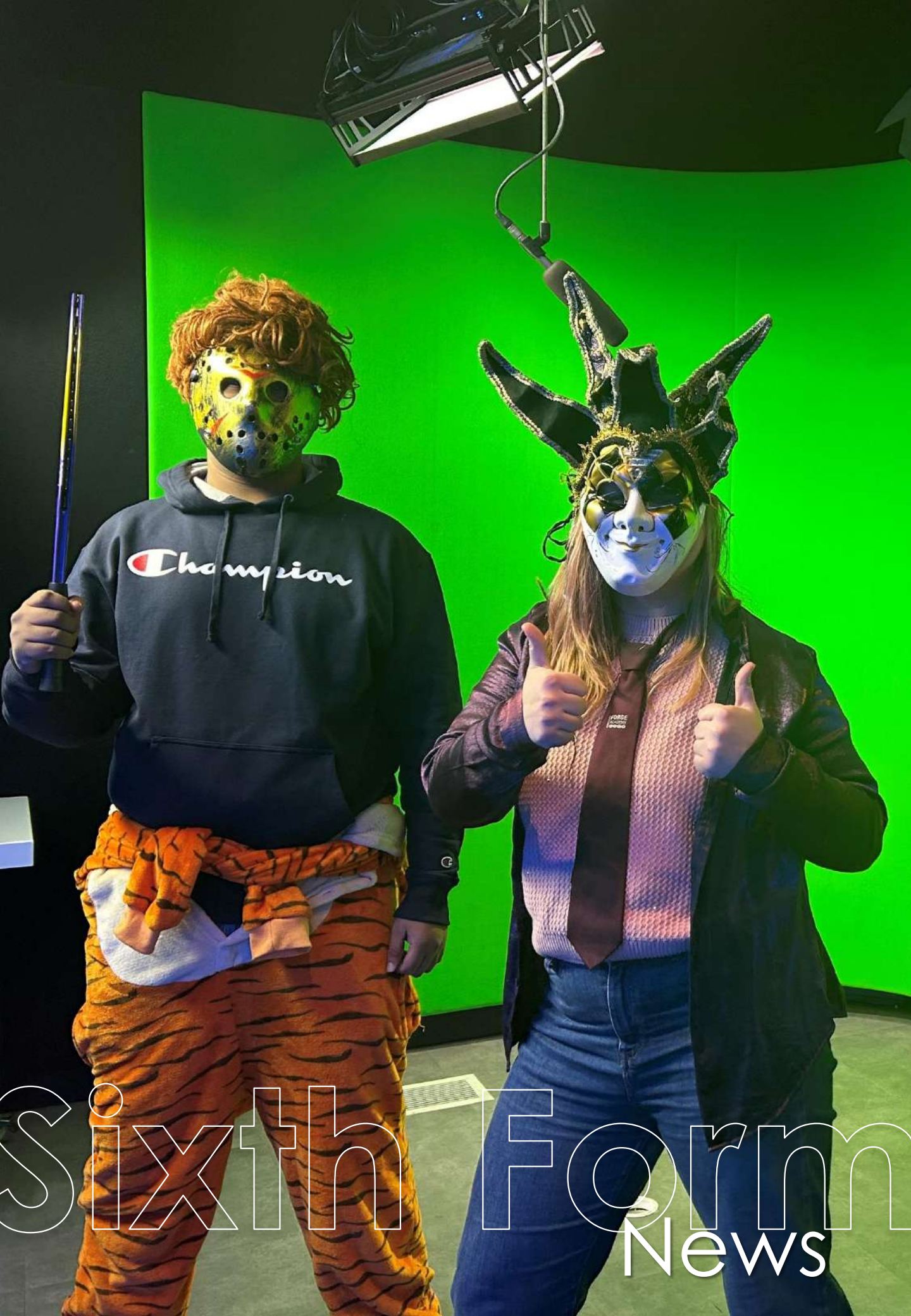
Did you know that exercise based video gaming (exergaming) can help too? In a recent pilot study at Kingston University, it was shown to improve concentration as well as maintain fitness levels. You might ask, what's wrong with just getting out there and engaging in regular exercise outside in the fresh air? Of course there's nothing wrong with that and in fact it should be actively encouraged, but often children with ADHD can find traditional forms of exercise tiring and boring or they struggle to fit in as part of a team with rules and boundaries to consider and remember. Exercise-based video gaming has proved to be an engaging alternative and can be tailored to suit the ADHD mind.

To find out more about this project and all things exercise, Dr Stone Hsieh, Senior Lecturer in Biological Psychology, will be talking about an innovative study he is running in this field in a webinar for us soon. Book [here](#).

Calls for interviews have started to come in and more will arrive in the next week. Interviews will often clash with the mock timetable. Students have been reassured that the exam schedule will be adjusted to fit round their interviews. Details of interview dates will be shared with the exams office so that papers can be rescheduled on a student by student basis to allow them to prepare for both effectively. Students need to act on feedback they received from the private tutor and follow up the additional links for interview prep that have been provided. Further interview support can be arranged as and when interviews are confirmed by the university.

The highlight of the trip was a hands-on workshop where students, split into three groups, were given their own studio to create an original movie trailer. With just 45 minutes to plan, film, and edit, each group was assigned roles such as director, editor, and actor. Despite the tight deadline, the students demonstrated impressive communication, teamwork, and creativity - though interestingly, all three groups opted to produce murder mystery or police crime drama trailers!

This engaging experience not only inspired creativity but also developed practical skills students will undoubtedly apply in their upcoming coursework and exams.

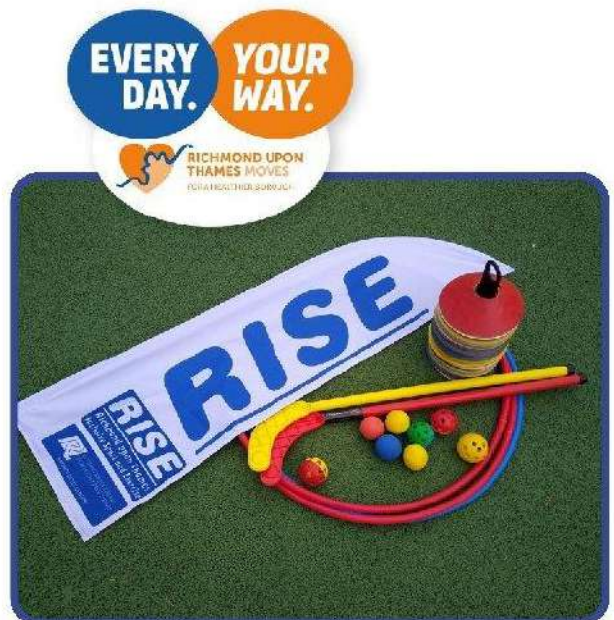
