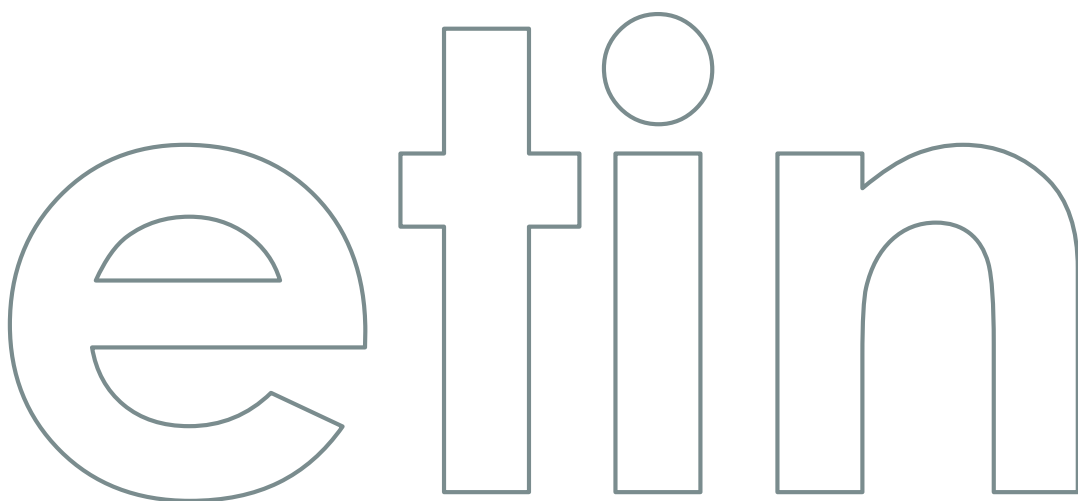

Break and lunch services will be available for other year groups as usual on these days

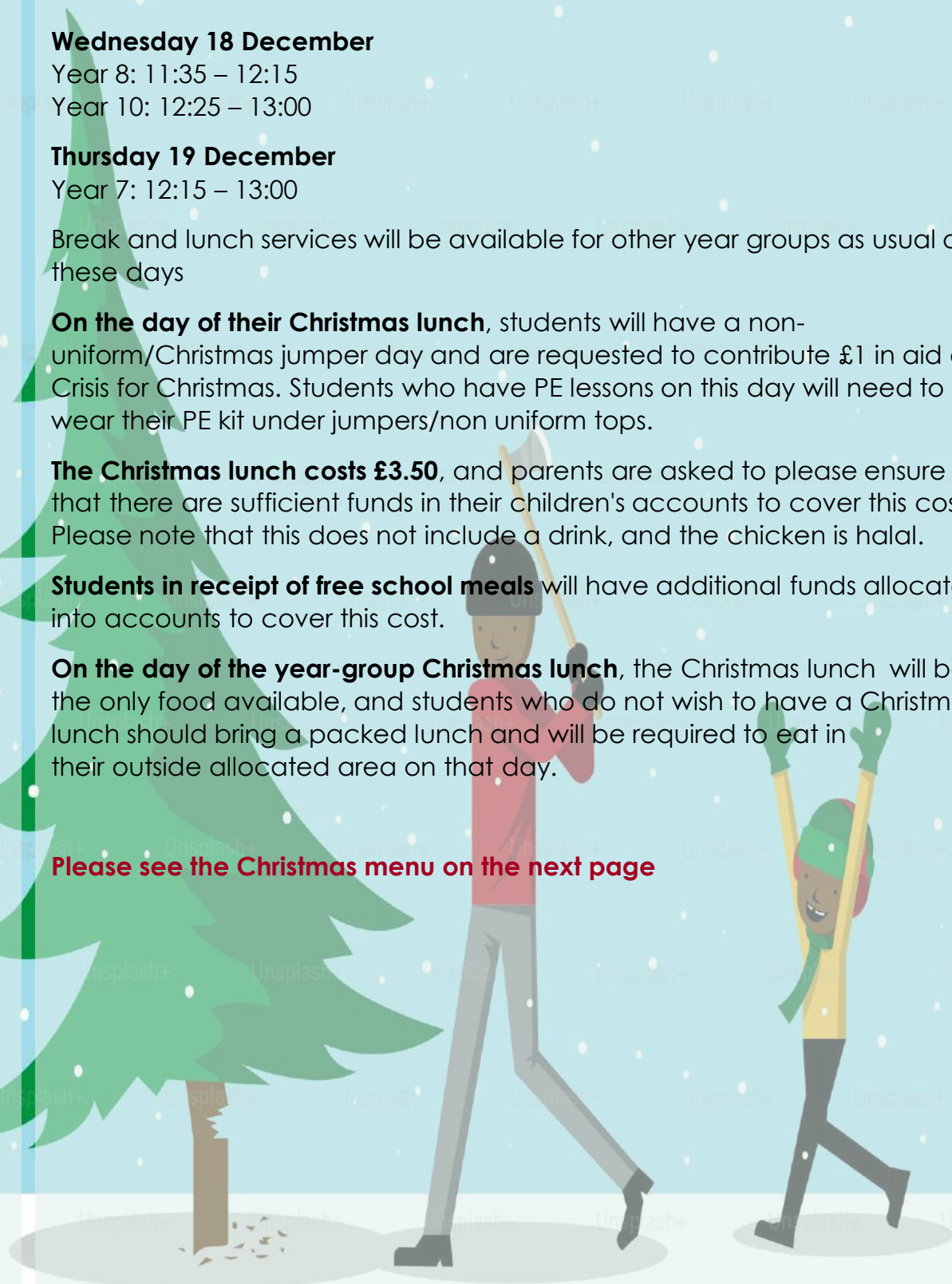

# *This week in* Science

It was a day that would go down in school history—or at least in the collective Snapchat memories of Years 10 and 11. In the laboratory, science met squeamishness as students took on dissections that tested not only their understanding of anatomy but also their ability to stomach the realities of biology.

For the Year 10s, it was heart-stopping stuff. With scalpels in hand, they prepared to explore the inner workings of a (lamb's) heart. "Don't Go Breaking My Heart," whispered one student to the organ on their tray, only to be told by their lab partner that this was actually the point of the exercise. The room filled with some nerves, mostly excitement and a lingering aroma of dead fish? The young cardiologists marvelled at the aorta and ventricles, using string to show the route of the blood, and observed the significant difference in ventricle size between the left and right sides of the heart.

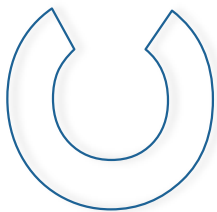
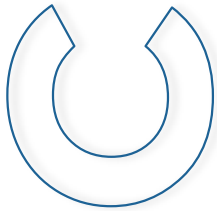
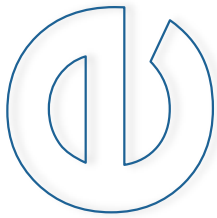








Meanwhile, Year 11s were engrossed in the iris and pupil, appreciating how the eye's structures transform light into the images we use to see.



The first obstacle was to cut through the sclera and squeeze out the vitreous humor. Those who accomplished this were able to extract the cornea to use as a magnifying glass (see pictures), and even (after a little rinse) see the tapetum lucidum (layer of tissue that reflects light onto the retina), optimistically likened by Indie Peters-Sutherland as 'Mother of Pearl.'

While some (Tia Garrard and Daniel Hardern) may have realised their heart surgeon calling, others (Katrina Killey and Leem Mohamed) could not have not been a further distance from their specimen, poking at the organ as if it could bite.

However, both years left the lab with a new appreciation for the human body—and possibly an uneaten lunch. The Biology department are pleased to report that after the use of 70 hearts and 10 eyes, no one fainted, vomited or ingested a piece of organ despite the inevitable muttering of bets.

The students filed out, some humming Elton John, others belting Wham! (maybe next year they'll be giving their hearts to someone special?) but all of them a little wiser and grateful for the miracle that is the human body.

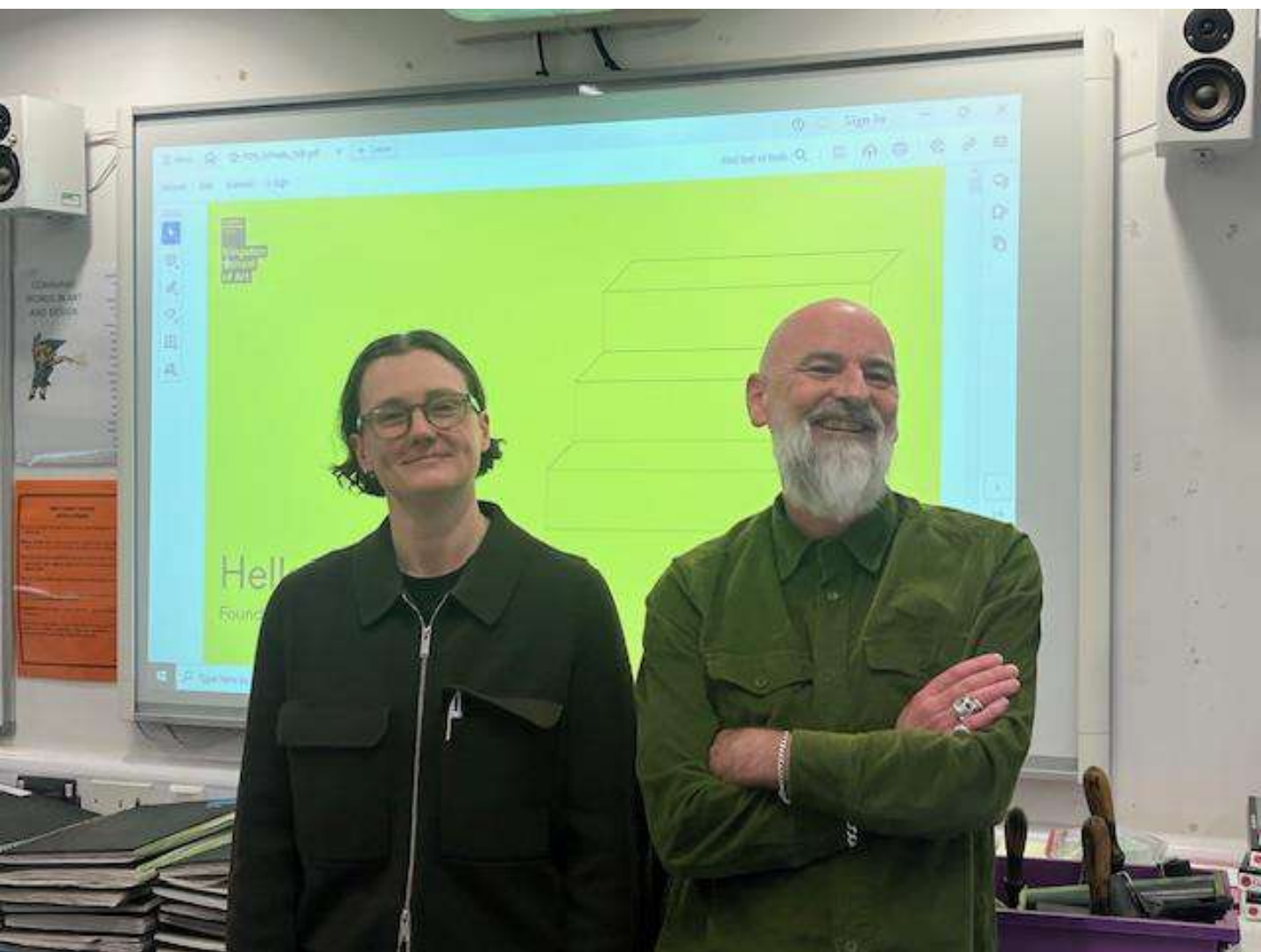

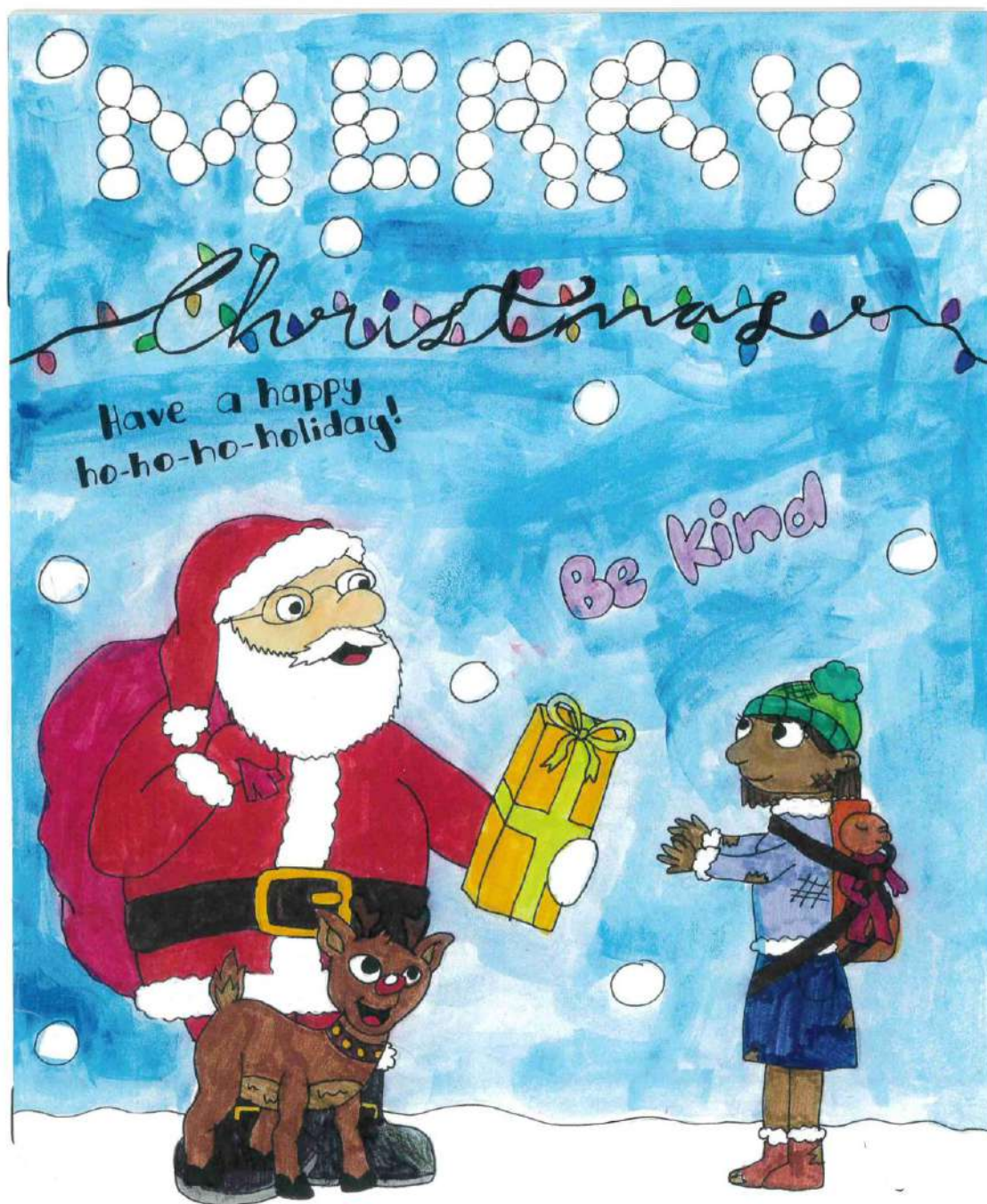
# Kingston School of Art Visit

### **Emilie Alexandre - Dance / Drama**

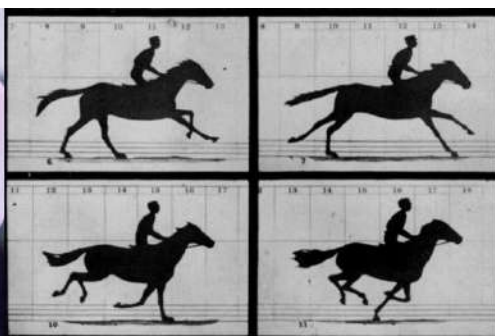

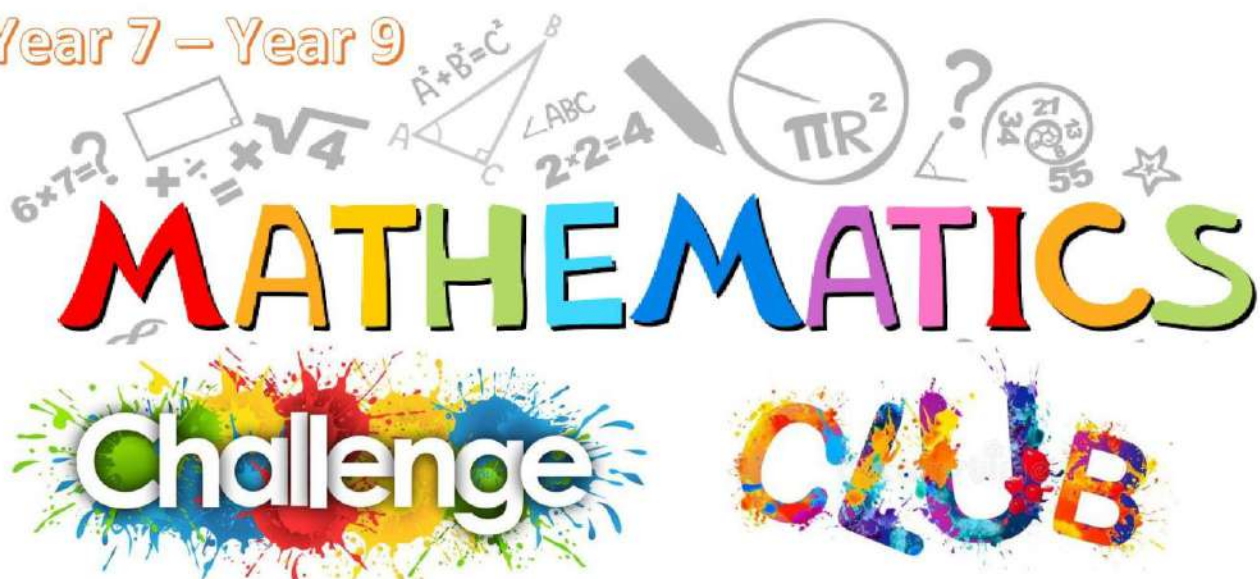

As a media teacher for 20+years I have always been a great advocate for the subject's capacity to inspire creativity, develop technological skills and encourage students to adapt, problem solve and work collaboratively. This belief has been anecdotally reinforced through seeing many of our own media students go on to take the subject at degree level and then work in media related industries. For example, we have media students who have taken the subject with us who are currently producing content for Brentford football club, Sheffield university and for an established film production company as we speak.

It is therefore encouraging to see that the experiences and opportunities the subject offers are starting to be acknowledged by academic and government studies. For example, a British academy report recently emphasised the value of students who are "highly literate in media and digital skills that are transferable to a broad range of industries, not least the creative industries sector which has grown 1.5 times the rate of the wider UK economy over the past decade." Professor Mansell of LSE's communications and media department further expanded on this claim when said that "education in these subjects supports a globally leading cultural sector" which at the last count contributed 108 billion pounds to the British economy.

With three classes of students taking the subject in year 11 under the expert producer-director partnership of Ms Howell, (Grey Court's answer to Oscar winning film director Kathryn Bigelow) and Ms Wood - the popularity of the subject is in no doubt. Indeed, this dynamic duo should be applauded for their efforts in organising, bribing, cajoling and encouraging all the students to produce upwards of 60 digital projects around the brief of "inclusivity" on time. Such an open ended theme has really allowed students to explore issues around identity, politics and society in a reassuringly, diverse and creative manner.

Projects of note in my own class of Pixar loving, TikTok adoring decidedly instagramable students have been truly BAFTA worthy! Temur Demiray visited central London to construct a Scorsesesque tracking shot in a busy market for a series of Tik Tok reviews on London's diverse restaurant scene. Meanwhile Mali Westbrook used an arthouse aesthetic to elevate her documentary on existential parenting to a piece worthy of a place in next year's Venice film festival. Ms Marsh, head of girls' PE, has also asked me to laud Ollie Aitkin's promo video on Grey Court's progress in making their football programme more inclusive.

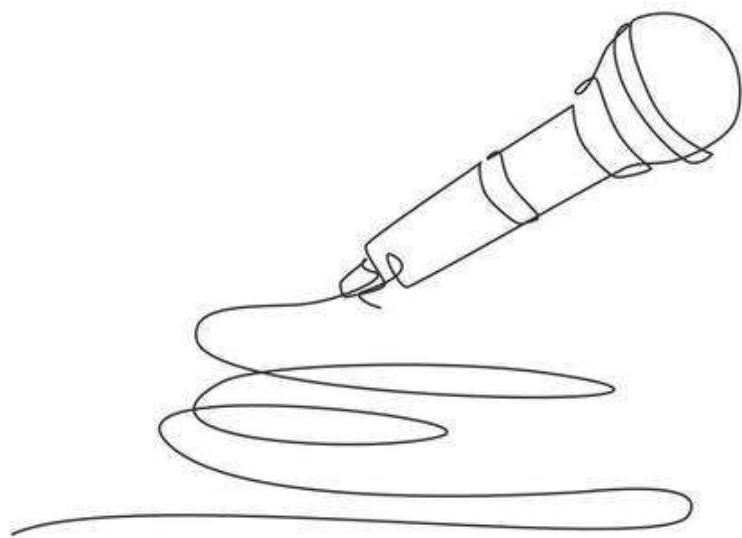
Laura Wise utilised a diverse cast of students and teachers to test make-up products and displayed a sense of humour and vivacity that will make her a prime influencer in future years, whilst Saskia Hollins' education piece on "WE" day felt as if it could grace the TED education platform. Elsewhere Amelia Davies' gender neutral perfume advert featured an unsettlingly alluring take on the "Fever" melody by songstress Peggy Lee. Exhaustive research methods underpinned Isabella Worth's graphic animation on diversity in hip hop, whilst both Aleeza Bilal and Myla Aihevba explored their respective Pakistani and Nigerian cultures through a series of beautifully constructed montages.

Any media class would not be complete without students who specialise in providing me with technical support, so well done to Ryan Mullen for being the class sound engineer and George Fennell for his expertise on uploading the finished products. Fabian Dobbs should be both commended and cautioned for risking life and limb in order to capture some great footage of mountain bike aerial for his piece on diversity in extreme sports.

As ever many of the students were tutored and coached by year 13 creative media students Jacob Ramsell, Helena Ferriera Dias and Jemima Dewar. Finally, I have to say that I had a great time working alongside the students for this module and learnt a great deal about the art of editing myself!

## 5-8 December in Swansea

*Unfortunately, the third day of events (Saturday) had to be cancelled due to the extreme weather so some swimmers missed out on their key events. Attached is a group photo however, Lucas is missing as it was so hard to get them all together at one time. Lucas's mum has sent you a separate photo and the others parents will also send results for their swimmers.*

**Results for Millie Morgan** (this was her first high level meet) and qualified for the 12/13 category which is tough as she is in the lower age group 12.

*Millie got personal bests in all her races (200m Back, 50m Fly, 400m Free, 50m Back, 100m Fly, 200m Free).*

*Her key results were*

- 4<sup>th</sup> in the 12 year old category in 400m Free*
  - 6<sup>th</sup> in the 12 year old category in 100m Fly*
- She is looking forward to competing more at this level in 2025.*

**Results for Charlie Morgan** and was racing in the 14/15 category so again this was tough as he is in the lower age group 14.

*Charlie got personal bests in all her races (200 Free, 200 Back, 200 IM, 800 Free, 50 Back, 1500 Free).*

*His key results were*

- reaching the final in the 200m free, and so coming 8<sup>th</sup> overall in the 14/15 category and 2<sup>nd</sup> in the 14 year category.*
- 3<sup>rd</sup> (Bronze medal) on the 800 Free in the 14/15 category and 1<sup>st</sup> in the 14 year category.*

It is **vital** that children in Years 7 and 12 are aware that they may need to apply for a new Zip Oyster photocard. It has not been possible to apply for a new Zip Oyster photocard since September due to the recent cyber incident. During this time, children with an expired Zip Oyster photocard have been allowed to travel on TfL services. However from **1 January** we will no longer be accepting expired Zip Oyster photocards for travel.

TfL have reopened applications for Zip Oyster photocards after the recent cyber incident. You can now apply for Zip Oyster photocards for ages 5-10, 11-15 and 16+ at [Free and discounted travel - Transport for London](#)

Expired photocards will not be accepted for travel on TfL or train operating company services from **1 January 2025**.

Please make sure you apply in time as the Post Office is often busier around Christmas. The last posting date is **18 December**.

Children need to show a valid Zip Oyster photocard to prove they are entitled to the free travel this affords (and have not had this privilege withdrawn for breaching the Young Person's Behaviour Code). It also allows TfL to understand how many children are travelling on bus routes and can support safeguarding in emergencies.

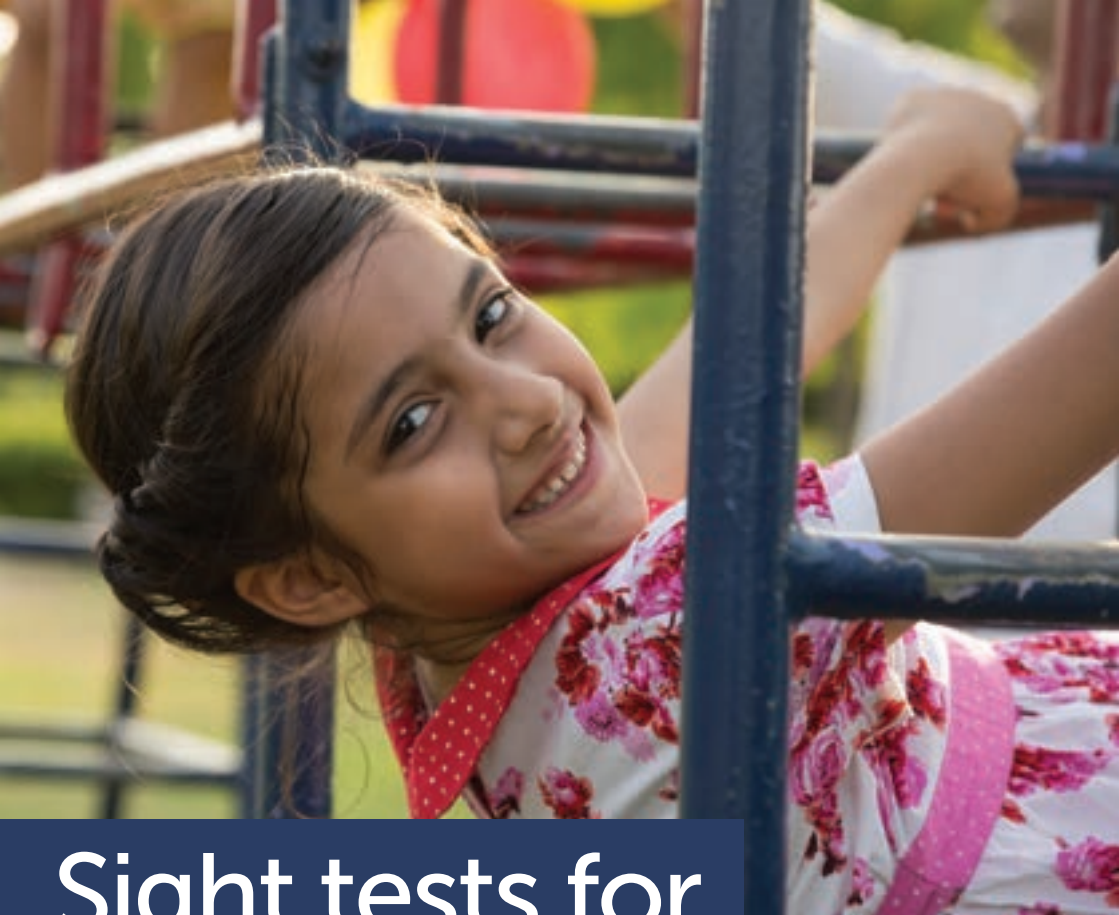

# Sight tests for children are **FREE!**

Short-sightedness is increasing, globally and in the UK. It is now twice as common as in the 1950s and children are becoming short-sighted at an earlier age.

- **Over 20% of parents have never taken their child for an eye test**
- **It is also more common in children whose parents are short-sighted.**

**Children from South Asian and African Caribbean families also have a higher risk of developing short-sightedness.**

The increase in close work such as reading, computers, small screens and spending less time outside has likely driven the rise in short-sightedness (myopia).

The College of Optometrists therefore recommend that children, particularly those aged 5 to 12:

- **Limit screen time**
- **Spend at least 2 hours every day outside**
- **Have regular sight tests**
- **When on the screen or reading - hold the device or book at least 30cm from the face**

The only way to prevent myopia from getting worse is with corrective lenses.

**This year public health Richmond will be encouraging schools to take part in termly “Disconnect to Reconnect” weeks in schools.**
