Growing Together

How Community Partnership Fuels the Grey Court Allotment Club



The vibrant display of greenery at Ham Library Gardens on Saturday 16 May was proof of what can be achieved when a community works together. The annual Plant Sale, hosted by the Ham United Group (HUG), was a true celebration of local partnership, brought to life by the combined efforts of passionate residents, dedicated volunteers and the students of the Grey Court Allotment Club.

Returning for their second year, our students proudly set up their stall alongside fellow growers. The morning was a massive success, raising an incredible **£460** which will go directly back into funding seeds, tools, and future green projects for students attending the club. However, the true success of the day was the powerful reminder that our Allotment Club simply could not exist without the deep roots of our local support network.

Months of Shared Dedication

The path to the plant sale began months ago, requiring a continuous team effort, including during our Tuesday lunchtime club to plant, nurture, and pot a diverse selection of plants. This year's stall featured a wonderful mix of student-grown crops like Rhubarb, Garlic, Vinca, Peas, Foxgloves, Mint, Spider Plants and Sisyrinchium. The preparation required great attention to detail. As Elias Hutchings explained:

"It was nice that so many people came to support us. I did lots of labelling and making plants look nice in the lead up to the sale. On the day I spoke to a lot of people coming to our stall to ask them if there was anything in particular they'd like to grow. I enjoyed talking to people and explaining about all the different plants we had grown."

Setting up the vibrant display was a team effort, with Jonathan Staple adding:

"I enjoyed carrying all the plants to help set up the stall and make it look presentable so people could see all the options to choose from."



Budding Gardeners Share Their Passion

Visitors to the stall were treated to a fantastic display of the practical knowledge the students have developed. Rather than just handing over plants, the club members were eager to share helpful tips and chat about what they had learned during their lunchtime sessions.

The students showed a wonderful understanding of how their plants grow and how they benefit the environment. Alexander Engelbrecht was happy to share with customers how *"spider plants make the air fresher and peas make soil better for growing,"* while Tayla Fard and Toni Arts delighted in sharing a bit of plant trivia, noting that *"people coming to the stall weren't aware the Latin name for foxglove is Digitalis that come in different colours!"*

For other students, the joy came from sharing the personal care they put into their crops. Luke Wang shared his secret to growing success:

"The best thing about the sale was showing off all the plants we have grown and telling people about how I talk to the plants and make them feel taken care of by watering them often and putting them in the best places to grow well."



Connecting with the Community

The sale perfectly captured the essence of community engagement, with students using great communication skills to connect with visitors.

Kyra Guyildar and Grace Middleton loved the opportunity to share their firsthand experience:

“I liked talking to everyone because I got to tell them about the plants I had grown in the allotment club, like beetroot, and the best place to plant it and how long it takes to fully grow.”

Returning club member Amity Reader used her experience from last year's sale to catch the crowd's interest:

“I enjoyed engaging with all the people coming and telling them how our club has been running for a long time. I let them know the strawberries we grow on the allotment taste really good. I learned that telling people how much the plant's shape and size can change in one week with new flowers and growth made them become even more interested and want to buy from our stall.”

This wonderful event is made possible through our brilliant partnership with **HUG (Ham United Group)**, which works as an umbrella organisation to support local projects centered around community empowerment, wildlife care, and environmental sustainability.

Since establishing this annual plant sale in 2024, HUG's core aim has been to bring people together, foster a sustainable future, and encourage residents to "just give gardening a go!" By offering a wide range of perennials, vegetables, annuals, and houseplants at low, accessible prices, HUG and our students successfully broke down barriers to gardening, welcoming green-fingered attendees and complete novices alike.

We were also delighted to welcome back the Mayor of Richmond upon Thames, Penny Frost, who paid another special visit to our stall this year. She spent time conversing with the students and was wonderfully supportive, noting how the allotment continues to be a fantastic space for developing teamwork, finding a sense of calm, and building immense pride amidst a busy school week.

The club's fantastic achievements were warmly celebrated by the school Leadership team, too. Associate Headteacher Ms Price, Deputy Head Teacher Mr Clements; the SENCO Ms Cook and school staff also visited the event to cheer on the allotment team and were incredibly impressed by the students' hard work, growing knowledge, and spectacular fundraising total.

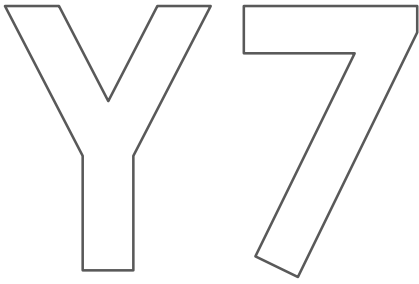

This will mean that if you miss your grades for your firm choice you will still be given a place on your insurance course and won't have to go through the Clearing process in August.

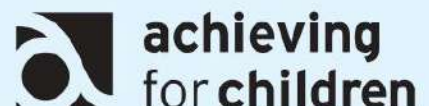
