A huge thank you to all our parents who donate their skills, time, and money to help us better our learning environment for our young people.

The kit-out of these rooms has only been possible through the generosity of our parents and their contributions to the Grey Court Education Fund, which pledged £100,000 towards this project. So far, the fund has donated £65,000, and we hope to complete the parental donations to complete this project during the 2026-2027 academic year.





Funds raised by G-Fest have turned a neglected corner of the school into a thriving functional space. Previously, behind the silver canteen and hall, was a muddy slope that blocked the whole school's drains with silt every time it rained, causing inconvenience and a lot of money.

Thanks to the Parents Association who funded a third of the cost of this renovation, we now have a calm and safe seating area that acts as a vital breakout space from the silver canteen, with trees providing natural shade from the heat of the midday sun (photos on cover page and the next page)

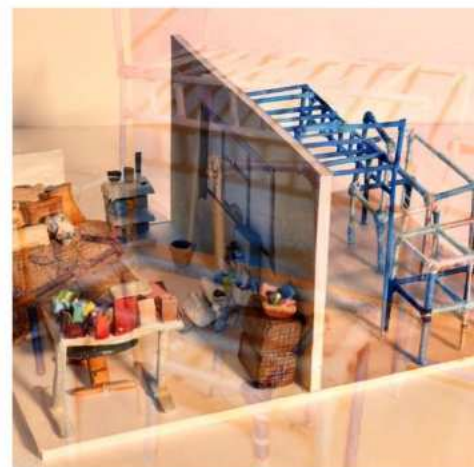

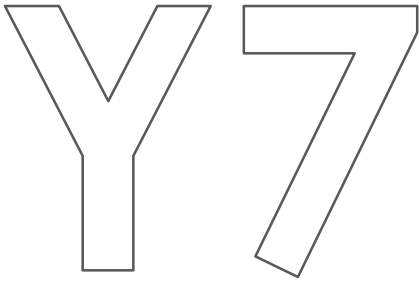

- 18 Gold Awards
- 43 Silver Awards
- 1 Bronze Award

Player of the Month

Evander Bye

Congratulations to Boys' PE Player of the Month for June, Evander Bye. Evander's progress over the past year has been exceptional. Having not featured in the athletics team last season, he has shown tremendous dedication and commitment to his training and has developed into one of our most promising young athletes.

His performances this season have been outstanding. At the Borough Athletics Championships, Evander produced a superb 200m personal best of 24.4 seconds to win his heat before backing it up with an impressive 24.8 seconds in the final to claim the gold medal.



He has also achieved personal bests of 12.45 seconds in the 100m and 9.98m in the triple jump, highlighting both his speed and athletic versatility.

Much of this success is down to the hard work he puts in week after week, training twice a week with Wimbledon Hercules in addition to his sessions with Grey Court. His commitment has already seen him qualify for the Middlesex Championships, while he also has his sights firmly set on competing at the Surrey Championships with Wimbledon. Regular appearances in Epsom & Ewell League meetings over the 100m, 200m and relay events are helping him gain valuable competitive experience early in the season.

Evander has set himself ambitious targets of breaking 12 seconds for the 100m and 24 seconds for the 200m this year, and based on his current trajectory, these goals are well within reach.

Away from athletics, Evander is also a talented rugby player. The speed, power and athleticism he has developed on the track will be a huge asset on the rugby field, where he will be hoping to challenge for a place in the U16 Rugby 7s squad that will go to the Rosslyn Park National 7s tournament next March.

Evander's attitude, work ethic and determination to improve make him thoroughly deserving of this month's Player of the Month award. Keep going, Evander and we look forward to seeing your progress on the track!

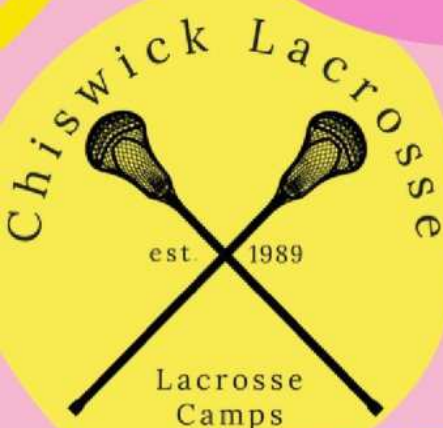
