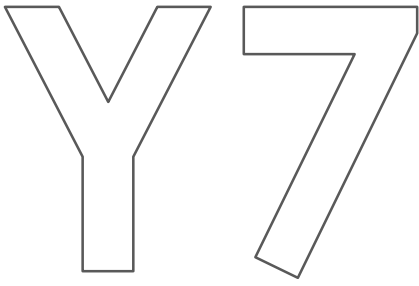

Last Saturday, Mrs Meadows took on *The Lap*, a gruelling 48-mile ultra-marathon around Lake Windermere.

Runners are given 24 hours to circumnavigate England's largest lake, which in theory offers magnificent views across the stunning Lake District Fells. However, continuous torrential rain meant visibility was non-existent—replacing the iconic scenery with low black clouds, slippery mountains, bogs, deep mud, and roughly 3,000 metres of relentless climbing.

With wet feet for hours, spectacular blisters, and about 10% of the field forced to drop out, determination was key. After 14 exhausting, muddy, and drenched hours, Mrs Meadows crossed the finish line to complete an incredible achievement!

PDW 35-hour challenge

UCAS

Students have so far been exceptional in their approach to their university applications and we have now started sending finalised applications off to UCAS. Please note that when a student clicks 'pay and send', it does not go directly to UCAS. It comes to our internal dashboard. At this point, students will meet with one of the sixth form team to double-check everything, complete their reference and predicted grades and then send off to UCAS. All PDW sessions and tutor time sessions are dedicated to UCAS at this point, so that students can access the support that they need. Once students have sent their UCAS forms off, they will receive their Academic Licence, provided that their attendance and punctuality are good.

Students need to communicate with Ms Higham regarding content for their bespoke references. For the next few weeks, enrichment sessions will be used to work on the applications as a priority over other enrichment choices.

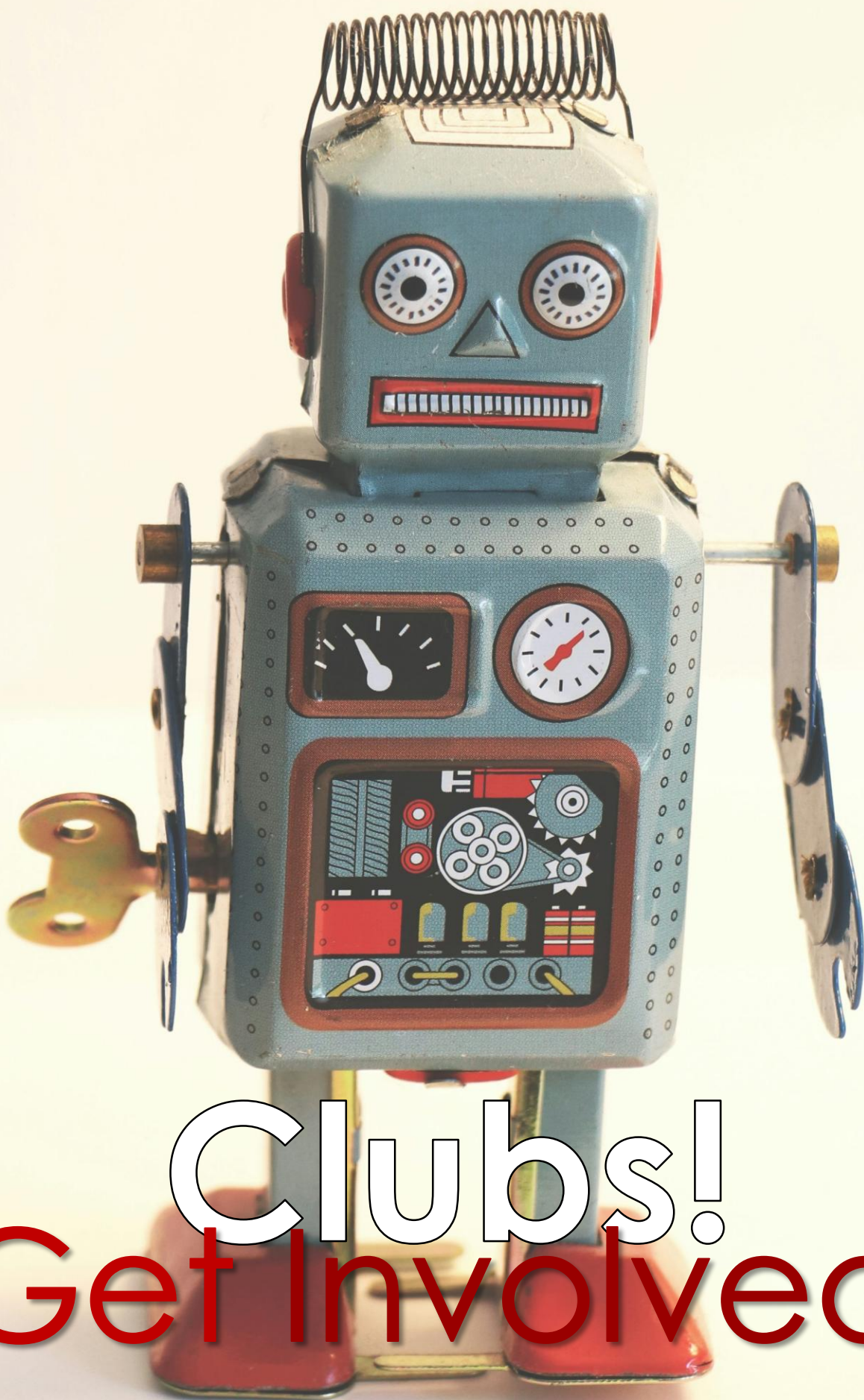

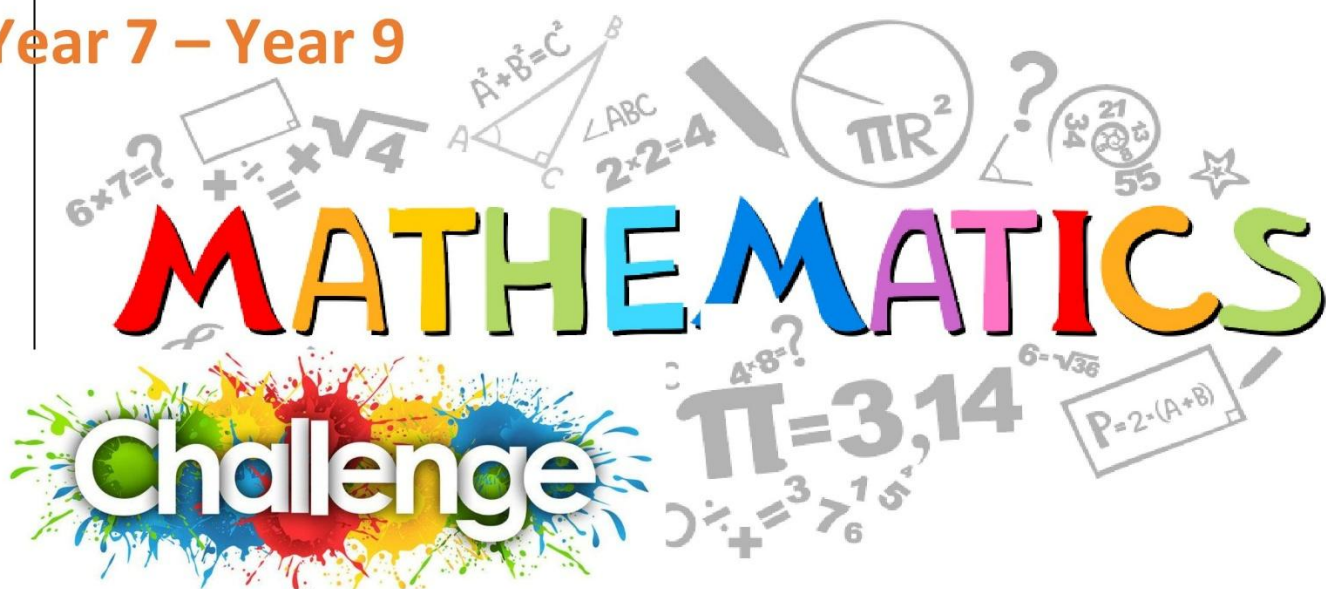
Elen Dutton

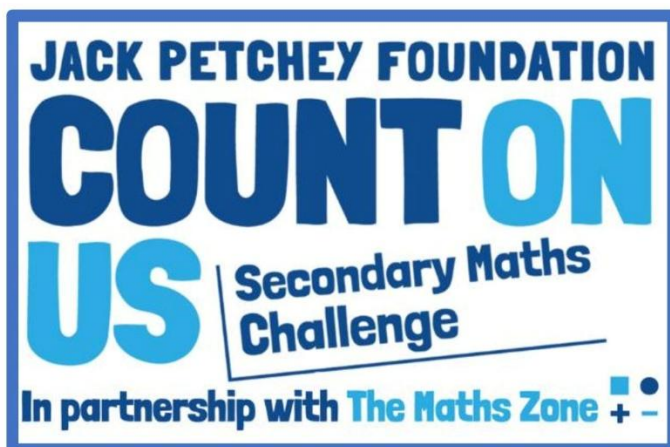
