STATEMENT OF INTENT

The school aims to promote positive approaches to students' appearance in the way they dress, fostering respect for themselves and preparing them, for the world of work and adult life. We operate in a climate which celebrates diversity of the individual but uniform must be consistently worn according to our rules.

UNIFORM POLICY

All students are required to wear the Grey Court School blazer with school badge. School jumpers are optional and may be worn under the blazer, not in place of the blazer. Sensible black formal leather shoes are to be worn by all students - canvas or suede shoes, boots, trainers, 'Vans' (or similar) and coloured laces are not acceptable. There should be no visible logos on the shoes. All uniform, especially PE kit, should be marked with the student's name. If belts are worn, they should be plain black.

Boys are to wear the blazer, a white formal shirt (tucked in) with tie and long black trousers. Trousers are not to be denim, cord, combat or cotton chino style.

Girls are to wear the blazer, a white revered blouse, long black trousers or the school skirt from the uniform supplier which is a tailored pleated skirt with a stag logo. Skirts should not be denim, knitted cord, lycra or cotton. The skirt length should be just above the knee. Trousers are not to be denim, cord, combat or cotton chino style.

In the summer term students may wear a school polo shirt (with the Grey Court School badge) as an alternative to the shirt and tie/revered blouse.

No jewellery except one pair of stud earrings; one plain ring; one bracelet and one necklace (which has to be worn under the shirt/blouse). No extreme hairstyles. Make up, nail varnish or false nails are not allowed. Headphones should not be visible or in use.
