English Society Literary Evening: Famous Writer Confirmed! by Mr Clements

After weeks of searching and a holiday spent practising a leap of faith, I can confirm that we have a famous writer lined up for the inaugural Grey Court Literary Festival which will literally be a literary evening as its inaugural.Luckily, as I'm organising the event, I've managed to persuade the esteemed travel writer, Tim Moore, to speak.



What a complete joy. The inaugural 6th Form Visual and Performing Arts Faculty **Show** was a triumph. The array of stimulation was astounding, from the sublime harp playing on the first floor to the visceral body parts exploding through the frames on the ground floor, the brilliance of the small screen media work and the media installation in the drama studio. The students should be extraordinarily proud of their work which was showcased with such serenity and maturity. The evening was a calm, reflective and highly enriching event introduced by the trio of guitars and drums outside to guide and welcome those in attendance. Once through the doors we were greeted by a showreel of the talented drama students performing monologues and short plays projected onto the wall and screened on the reception monitor. As we strolled around the corner, we were met by a bursting gallery richly-saturated with sculpture, painting, installation, photography, drawing and wonderful mixed media work. The work of the BAFTA winning Ms Finnie (as she likes to be described) was particularly impressive and the meaty, fleshy, dehumanised carcass-work of Ms Harris was somewhat arresting. Lured by rows of flashing screens and awaiting headphones, we ambled gently into a computer room where we were overcome by the astonishing array of media and film work produced by the BTEC students who demonstrated their skills in a range of techniques and very wide range of content. Drama students again, silently, demonstrating their skills on the bigger screen. Awash with creative thinking and brains stimulated we wander down the corridor to the Drama studio. Standing centre stage, we experience the installation work of sound and image, collage of repetitive noises, images and actions on screen and in surround sound, we are immersed into a world of domestic tedium and drudgery the contradiction of the pleasure generated by the experience and the content was genius.

And now we climb the stairs to the workbooks, the harpist and the drink. The detail, the tenacity, the depth of process explored in the workbooks made them treasure to discover. Our students are so amazing, and might not have this attitude without such inspiring teachers. Parents gathered to witness, and share, the end of an era, as their sons and daughters will no longer be crossing the threshold and now move to independence. For one family, Grey Court has been a 13 year journey and this was a very fitting send off with work of such sophistication, imagination, execution and artistry. We should ALL be very proud.




It's PRIDE MONTH!


To whom it may concern,

I am writing to propose an idea regarding the theme of this month -Pride Month.


