### **STATEMENT OF INTENT**

The school aims to promote positive approaches to students' appearance in the way they dress, fostering respect for themselves and preparing them for the world of work and adult life. We operate in a climate which celebrates diversity of the individual but uniform must be consistently worn according to our rules.

### **UNIFORM POLICY**

All students are required to wear the Grey Court School blazer with school badge and silver trim daily (including with PE kit).

School jumpers are optional and may be worn under the blazer, not in place of the blazer. Sensible black formal leather shoes are to be worn by all students. Canvas or suede shoes, boots, trainers, 'Vans' (or similar sporting brands) are not acceptable. There should be no visible logos or a discreet logo only on the shoes.

If belts are worn, they should be plain black with a small, plain buckle.

Students either wear a white shirt buttoned to the neck together with the school tie (with the logo visible) or a white reversed collar (open necked) shirt.

Trousers should be black and not denim, cord, combat or cotton chino style.

The only acceptable skirt is the Grey Court school skirt with the logo on the left hem.

All uniform - especially PE kit - should be marked with the student's name.

In the summer term, students may wear a school polo shirt (with the Grey Court School badge) as an alternative to the shirt and tie/reversed blouse.

**No hoodies, including Grey Court hoodies, are to be worn.**

Uniform should be worn correctly and **appropriately sized**. PE shorts and skirts should not be rolled up. Skirts should be around knee length and shorts mid thigh length and loose fitting.

### **PE KIT**

All kit should be the normal branded blue kit, but plain, navy, unbranded jogging bottoms from Schoolzone may be worn. If students are wearing black leggings, shorts must be worn over them.

### **JEWELLERY, HAIR & MAKE UP**

No jewellery except one pair of stud earrings should be worn. No other piercings or jewellery should be worn. No extreme hairstyles or tramlines should be worn. Hair should be one, natural colour. No eye make up can be worn. Fake eyelashes are not allowed. Nail varnish, shellac, gelish or other alternative nail products including acrylics or false nails are not allowed. Headphones should not be visible or in use.
