





Summer EVENTS

How has the summer come around so quickly! Breaking up for the summer holidays is exciting and a huge relief from classroom restrictions but, for those with ADHD, long days and lack of structure have the potential to be not as relaxing as parents/carers might like.

It's so tempting to ditch any kind of schedule as soon as school has broken up - but keeping some structure is important and will make it easier for your child to stay organised and get back into a routine in September. Try and ensure they get plenty of fresh air and exercise - an old cliche but it does make a difference for all of us. As little as half an hour a day can help manage ADHD symptoms.

Aim to keep a regular sleep schedule and regular meal times. Maybe set some holiday goals that are fun things to do, things that will enhance your child's self-esteem. It could be something as simple as getting the stabilisers off the bike or finishing a song they were learning to play or a book.

The summer holidays are a great time for your child to learn something new try and prepare them for any new activity by talking them through what will happen, to ease any anxieties they may have and ensure they are aware in advance of basic rules, especially if they're engaging in something with an instructor.

Children with ADHD often tend to be creative - an arts and crafts, music or pottery day would allow their creativity to flourish and it doesn't need to be an organised class, it can be something you can set up yourself at home, in the garden or even in the local park.

Having said all this, remember that for children with ADHD, school can be a major source of stress and pressure so you want the summer holidays to be a time when your child can relax and have a freer rein. Allow them to take the lead and have input into their summer plans - the more control they have, the more likely they are to stick with their chosen activity. Here are some local activities and summer camps we have put together!

- **Ham House:** National Trust Summer of Play 22 July to 31 August. The formal gardens will be transformed into a giant playzone for families to enjoy free games.
- **Ham Youth Centre:** Starting Mon 24 July, Ham Youth Centre is offering four themed weeks for 10 16 year olds where they can try new activities and make friends.



For team Richmond, this is the first time every athlete that competed came away with a medal - **Mr Jones** (Richmond Team Manager)








