

1. Astronaut Life


Exploring the science behind astronauts' journeys to space, their living experiences, and the complexities involved in extravehicular activities outside the station.

2. The Universe


Understanding how telescopes and probes aid our comprehension of the vastness of the cosmos. The discussion also delved into the gravitational forces governing planetary orbits around stars.

I was so pleased with the ease and maturity that Year 11 embraced the new mobile phone procedure and I have seen calm revision sessions between exams and an overall positive attitude towards how they felt exams have gone. I hope this continues for the rest of their exams and that their hard work is paid off with an excellent set of results in January, Remember, once students receive their exam results, there will be a Parent's Evening where you can discuss progress with your child's subject teachers.

A reminder of the INSET day and no school on Monday - an opportunity for Year 11 to recharge, relax and get back to revision for the last push. We then begin to look forward to the end of (a very long and challenging!|) term and our Celebration Assembly - a real time for our Year 11 superstars to be applauded for their hard work and dedication. Have a wonderful weekend and wrap up warm!

Last week I received the following email from Ms Higham commending the kindness of sixth formers, Reuben Mauthner and Evan King:

"Thank you so much for being such exemplary citizens last week when you helped a local Senior citizen after they fell. They had called the school to try and work out who you both were so that we could pass on their thanks to you because they were incredibly grateful."

I hope this will come as no surprise to parents but we receive many calls, letters and emails from members of the public commending the conduct of students. Over the past year students have been praised for their volunteering, fundraising, rescuing of local dogs, politeness on buses, first aid skills and honesty. The celebration of these numerous acts of kindness has been the theme of the assemblies I have delivered to all years over the past week.

In these presentations I have emphasised how the principles of kindness, politeness and charity are embedded in a range of religious teachings that include Islam, Christianity and Buddhism. For the secular I have referenced how acts of charity and kindness induce the generation of more oxytocin, a chemical that raises the mood and

consequently individual self-esteem.

I also used the occasion of having the ears of 265 students a day to promote the cult of "Lightning McQueen" whereby the protagonist from Pixar's "Cars" series" evolves into a less selfish racing car when he engages in teamwork in the town of Radiator Springs. Indeed, such is my admiration for the family themed franchise that I have advised all students to watch Cars 1, 2 and 3 as well as *Planes1 and 2* as a loose pentalogy. I hope they take my advice!

However, for every Lightning McQueen there is a Chick Hicks (the villain in "Cars" for the uninitiated) and, it is sad, to say that members of the public do write in with complaints regarding Grey Court students. Although the complaints post sack is relatively light compared to the compliments sack, these issues raised are real. relevant and resolvable if like the Radiator Springs community our efforts are collective. The three most common complaints are in no particular order: Language use, dangerous cycling and conduct on buses.

My assembly therefore presented the students with some simple solutions which I have every faith they will adopt. These were as

follows: cycle with a helmet on your head rather than dangling from your handlebars, say "please" and "thank you" to members of the public when you engage with them, offer you seat to Ham's citizens when travelling by public transport, participate in an activity that will make a positive contribution to your community and finally: smile!

I concluded my assembly with a photo of my grumpy self with Ms Shaw's dog, Teddy. I inquired about the mutt's well-being in a polite manner, offered to lend it my cycle helmet and joined the queue to walk Teddy around the school grounds at lunch. The results were immediate it might be quite hard to discern - but my mouth appears to be upturned in a smile.





Future Chef Local Heats




Whilst all students produced wonderful dishes two really stood out. These two students represented Grey Court on Friday in the cook off again two other schools.

Year 13 Mock Exam Protocols




Lee Valley Indoor Athletics


